The Consortium for Social and Policy Research on HIV, Hepatitis C and Related Diseases will offer a number of scholarships for Aboriginal students in 2008 to enhance the capacity of the Aboriginal health workforce.

Students will study at the National Centre in HIV Social Research (NCHSR) based at the University of New South Wales (UNSW). NCHSR is a dynamic academic environment with a proven track record in research that influences policy and practice in the areas of HIV, hepatitis C, illicit drug use and sexual health.

Scholarships are available for Graduate Diploma, Masters by Research and PhD students to undertake research into HIV, hepatitis C, sexually transmissible infections and illicit drug use. The degrees will include opportunities to develop innovative research projects that will be of benefit to Aboriginal communities, with the intent of improving outcomes in Aboriginal health.

Personal tutors and other support for students are available from Nura Gili Indigenous Programs at UNSW. Combined coursework with Nura Gili is also available. Other forms of specialised tutorial assistance can be supported through the Consortium. **Applications close on 20 December 2007.**
